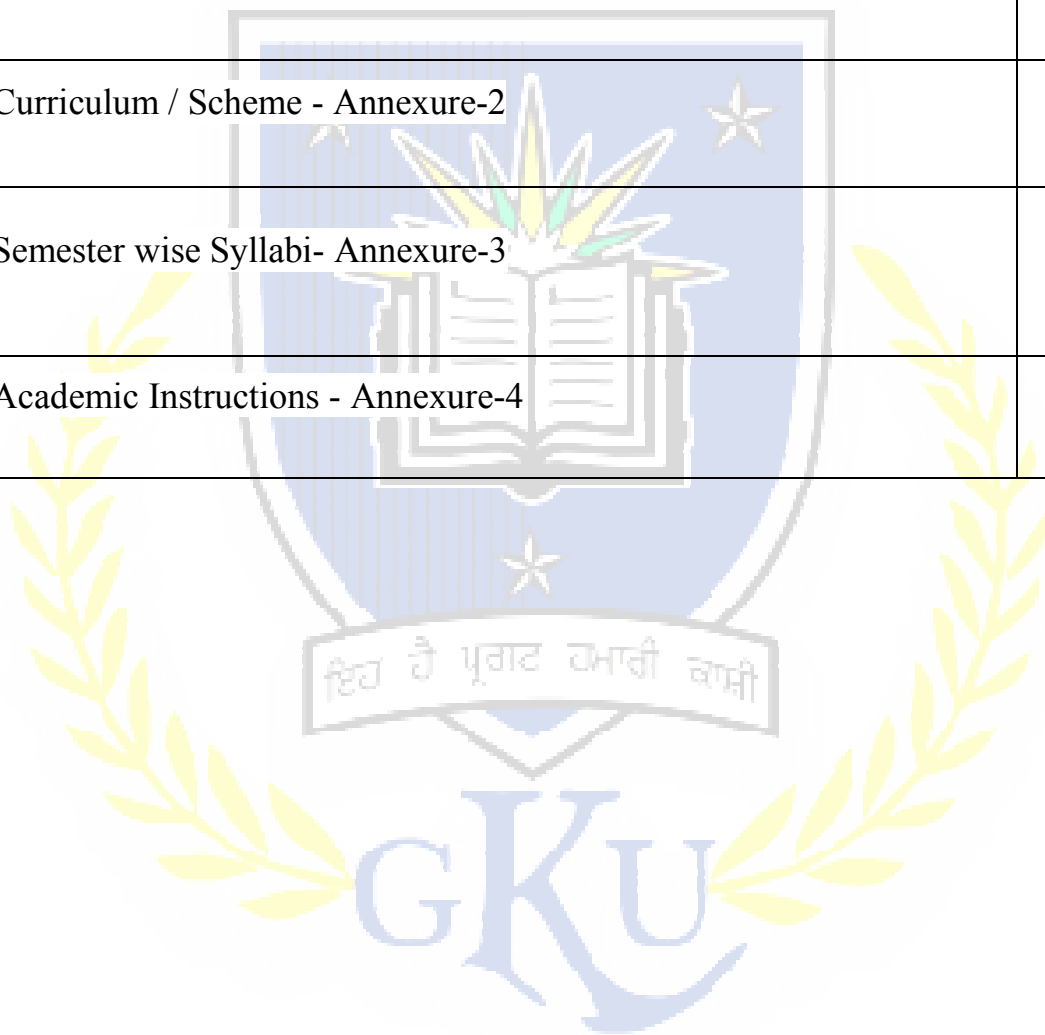

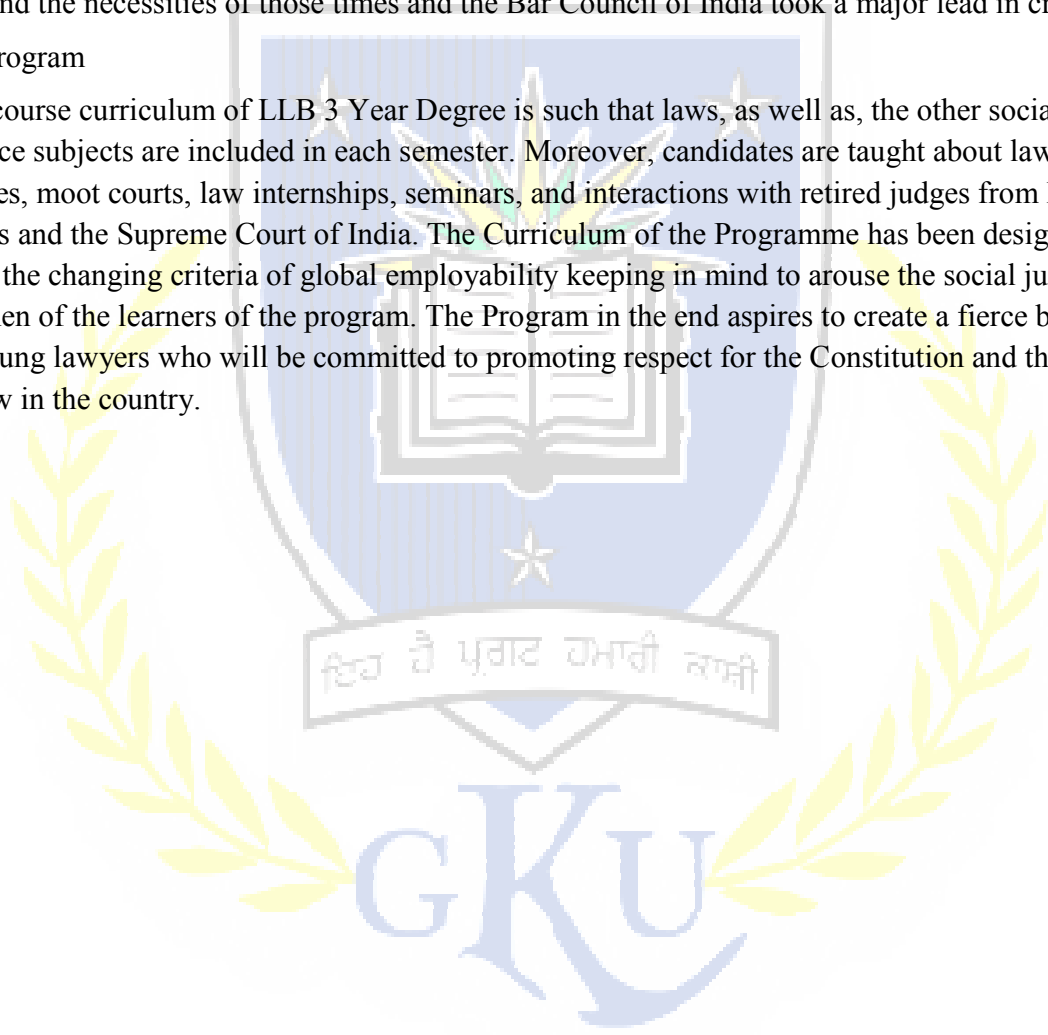




### **Introduction of Program LLB**

The students have to pass both in internal and external examinations. The minimum passing marks to clear in examination is 40% of the total marks.
